

1. Façade Garden

Hardy perennials lining the front of our hotel include hosta, foxglove + delphiniums in back and cosmos, pansies + violas curbside, creating a glorious showy garden.

2. Durant Avenue Garden

Bright, flowering perennials + showy annuals create a blooming area to welcome hotel guests and passersby.

3. Element 47 Garden

Inspired by the Highline in New York City, beautiful perennials provide an abundance of blooms. This garden also provides food for butterflies and insects.

4. Hillside Garden

Shade-loving plants like ferns, hostas and lilies fill this sloped garden. White annuals ensure this garden looks bright + beautiful morning, noon and night. Hummingbirds often visit these flowers to collect their afternoon nectar

5. Courtyard Garden

From the indigenous columbine, Colorado's state flower, to non-native Asiatic Lilies, this garden features a variety of flora lining our living wall.

6. Living Wall
