Biju wanted to share his energizing cuisine with his community, which led to the conception of The Little Curry Shop. He co-authored the FeedZone cookbooks along with Dr. Allen Lim, and is a co-founder of the Boulder-based hydration and nutrition company SkratchLabs. The Little Curry Shop pop-up dinner is offered for an approachable 3 for \$47 prix fixe menu. Master Sommelier Carlton McCoy will be available to suggest wine pairings, recommending Riesling and dry wines to tame the spice of Indian cuisine.
